

Household Plastic: How to Collect It



Belongs in the collection bag



Films of all kinds:

Cling films, vacuum bags, carrier bags, checkout bags, magazine films, sixpack films, shrink films, stretch films ...



Put waste loosely in the collection bag and do not put it in other containers.



Plastic bottles of all kinds:

Bottles of oil, vinegar, shampoo, detergents and cleaning agents ...



Air out, lid on.



Plastic trays:

Vegetable, fruit, butter and meat trays, egg and biscuit packaging, thermoformed trays from nurseries (e.g. for seedlings) ...



Separate the film from the plastic tray, as these are usually made of different plastics.



Cups, pots and containers:

Plastic cups for yoghurt, quark, crème fraîche and spreads, flower pots ...



Press together and do not stack into each other, remove paper and aluminium and dispose of separately.



Care product packaging:

Tins, tubes, soap dispensers, refill bags ...



Dispose of paper, aluminium and glass separately.



Beverage cartons (e.g. Tetra Pak):

Verpackungen von Milch, Rahm, Eistee, Suppen, Fruchtsäften ...



Air out, lid on.



Packaging made of composite materials with a thin aluminium layer:

Packaging for chips, peanuts, pretzel sticks, drink pouches ...



Put waste loosely in the collection bag and do not put it in other containers.

Does not belong in the collection bag



Packaging made of composite materials with a thick aluminium layer:

Packaging for wet food, coffee beans, medicine blister packs ...



This packaging can neither be recycled nor used as a substitute fuel.



Heavily soiled packaging:

No packaging with residual contents or marinade



Office supplies:

Folders, highlighter pens, adhesive tape dispensers, empty correction rollers ...



Toys and garden articles:

Figures, rubber and plastic toys, balls, garden hoses, garden furniture ...



Toys and garden furniture in good condition are welcome at second-hand shops.

Belongs in separate collections



PET beverage bottles:

Beverage bottles and some milk bottles; note the PET logo!



PET bottles with the PET logo have their own material cycle, which is financed by an advance recycling fee. They can therefore be handed in free of charge at the official collection points.



Styrofoam / Sagex :

Officially EPS (expanded polystyrene)



EPS has its own material cycle and can be disposed of at most recycling centres.
